You have just opened the Proceedings of the 17th edition of the **STUDENT EEICT 2011** competition. The abbreviation in the name of this event stands for **E**lectrical **E**ngineering, **I**nformation and **C**ommunication **T**echnologies, which describe the priority specializations of the organizing faculties – the Faculty of Electrical Engineering and Communication and the Faculty of Information Technology of the Brno University of Technology.

The conference was organized in the framework of specific research at the Faculty of Electrical Engineering and Communication and Faculty of Information Technology under support from Ministry of Education, Youth and Sports. The JobFair event is a new part of the conference focused on our industrial partners. And finally, the conference has obtained many significant media partners.

As already indicated, industrial partners play a very significant role in the frame of the competition. The organizing faculties are highly interested to meet companies' demands both in the education of their potential new employees (today's students of faculties) and in their research. Therefore, the organizers highly appreciate the goodwill of companies to nominate members of commissions evaluating students' projects, to participate in publishing proceedings of the competition, and to financially support the competition.

I hope the 17th edition of the **STUDENT EEICT 2011** competition is successful for all the participants. Students cannot only win prizes but also can hear the opinion on their development from industrial specialists. They can build contacts with companies. Companies can meet excellent students and offer them further cooperation or even job. And teachers can compare results reached by their students with results of students supervised by their colleagues.

I would like to thank all students and participants who contributed to the success of the competition. I believe that all of them have gathered much experience, inspiration and motivation for their further research work and that they will retain pleasant memories of a frank and open atmosphere of the competition.
